



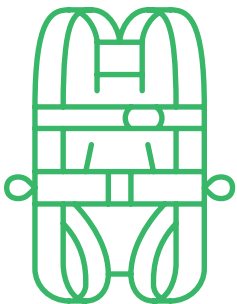
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# TOP 10 OSHA VIOLATIONS

### 1. Fall Protection



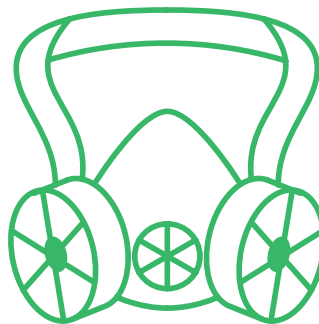

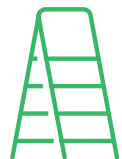

## 5 Actions to take now

Establishing a safety program in your workplace is one of the most effective ways to protect your workers and your company. Your plan should include worker training, proper equipment maintenance, and good documentation with an enterprise asset management (EAM) system.

### 1. Establish proactive equipment maintenance

Work orders should prompt regular equipment inspections, and checklists can help identify potential equipment issues before safety incidents occur.

### 2. Deploy EAM software support

### 3. Train employees

Always keep records of your training efforts so you can answer to the first question an incident investigator will ask: "Did the employee receive adequate training to do the job?"

### 4. Communicate often

Encourage discussion of concerns, suggestions, and reporting of injuries, incidents, and hazards, while documenting any issues.

### 5. Provide personal protective equipment

A modern EAM system can notify technicians of the personal protective equipment required for specific tasks before they begin and create a notification when a new supply is needed.
