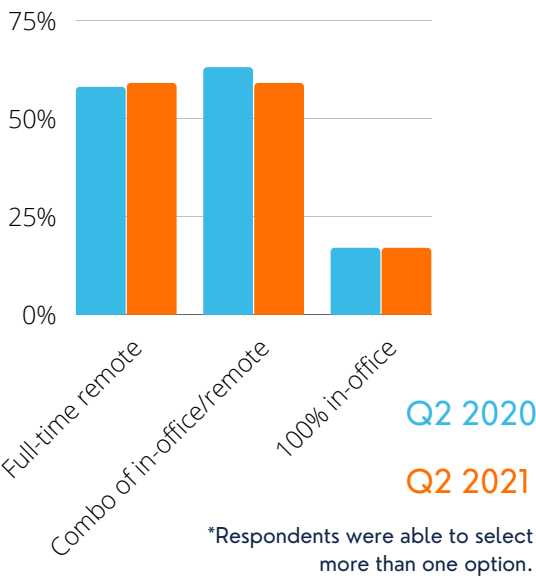

75% of survey respondents were either very or somewhat satisfied with their careers in Q2 2021, compared to 67% in Q4 2020.

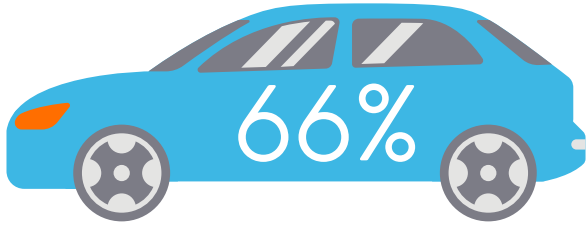
Remote & flexible work wishes

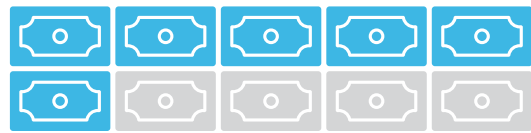


Employee benefits of remote work

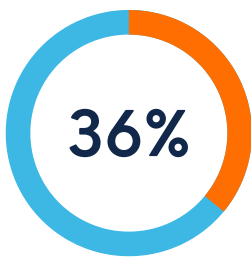


66% of workers saved anywhere from 30 minutes to 2 hours in commuting time when working remotely.

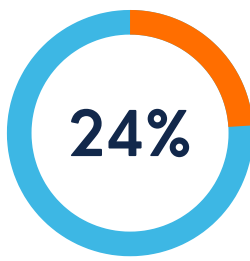
67% of respondents saved from \$100-\$300/month in commuting costs.



Work-life balance



36% of technologists said they were burned out by their job.



24% of technologists felt their work-life balance is worse than pre-pandemic.

Technologist cited the following as their top reasons for burnout:

1. Workload
2. Hours worked
3. Lack of recognition
4. Lack of challenges / monotony
