Pharmacist:

The Pharmacist must have equivalent qualifications, competence and function in the same role as employed individuals performing the same or similar services at the facility, as defined by facility job description

Definition of Care or Service:

The Pharmacist is legally responsible for all functions performed by supportive personnel (i.e., pharmacy techs, pharmacy students/interns/externs) and checks all work specified by law. Scope of Service may include:

- Prescribes (Consults with physicians, nurses and other staff members concerning patient-specific drug
 therapy issues [drug selection, indications, allergies, contra-indications, side effects and adverse
 reactions, dosage, and product availability]; encourages rational, appropriate, and cost-effective drug
 therapy by suggesting formulary alternatives when non-formulary drugs are prescribed; utilizes the
 patient medication profile reviews and evaluates all medication and IV orders; performs parenteral
 nutrition when electrolyte, base components, and lipid formulations require adjustments)
- Dispenses (Processes, dispenses and checks all physician's medication and IV solution orders [unit dose drawers, first doses, extemporaneous preparations, sterile products, outpatient prescriptions, etc.] appropriately with 100% accuracy and in a timely manner; maintains all legally required documentation [i.e., medication order processing, controlled substances, investigational drugs, etc.]; coordinates order processing and compounding of total parenteral nutrition [TPN]and intravenous solution with 100% accuracy; coordinates the accurate and timely processing and preparation of chemotherapeutic agents assuring that all special compounding procedures for handling chemotherapy agents are performed; and assures the proper compounding, labeling and dispensing of all extemporaneous products are in accordance with established pharmaceutical guidelines and compendia.)
- Educates (Provides accurate, adequate and timely drug and poison control information to staff; participates in orientation, education and training for staff; provides drug education to patients and their families.)
- Monitors (Monitors drug therapy regimens for contraindications, drug-drug/drug-food/drug-herbal
 interactions, allergies and appropriateness of drug and dose; provides pharmacokinetic consult service;
 documents all clinical activities and interventions accurately and completely [drug utilization
 evaluations, patient rounds, restricted drugs, renal dosing, etc.]; reviews/interprets culture and
 sensitivity data for antibiotic appropriateness and recommends changes as needed; detects and
 reports suspected adverse drug reaction and medication errors accurately and in a timely manner;
 coordinates TPN/IV microbial sterility testing [quality assurance] according to procedures.)
- Understands the authority, accountability and auditing related to controlled substance management
- Assists in training pharmacy techs, students, interns/externs, residents, faculty, providers
- Includes adult and pediatric patients
- Provides direct supervision of support personnel in the immediate assigned area
- Plans, implements and modifies treatment programs
- Examines patient's medical history
- Accepts and dispenses prescription medications



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- Provides consultation on prescription and non-prescription medications for storage, dosage, side effects, and drug interactions
- Prepares sterile solutions following proper procedures
- Supervises pharmacy staff members including pharmacy technicians, pharmacy clerks, etc.
- Appropriately manages patient records and pharmacy files
- Maintains appropriate inventory of pharmaceutical and medical supplies
- Identifies patient's drug-related problems and effectively communicates with physicians and other healthcare practitioners
- Works in conjunction with physicians, nurses, other pharmacists, pharmacy interns, etc.
- Provides specialized educational programs and health promotions to help patients manage chronic health conditions such as hypertension and diabetes
- Demonstrates Clinical and Service excellence behaviors to include HCA Healthcare code of conduct core fundamentals in daily interactions with patients, families, co-workers and physicians

Setting(s):

• Healthcare facilities including but not limited to hospitals, outpatient treatment facilities, ambulatory surgery centers, and physician practices.

Supervision: Direct supervision by department director, site manager or designee.

Qualifications:

- Bachelor degree or higher in Pharmacy
- Current state license as a Pharmacist.

Texas requires a Pharmacist license through the Texas State Board of Pharmacy

Experience:

• Six months experience in a retail or hospital environment as a pharmacist.

Competencies:

The Pharmacist will:

- Demonstrate safe, effective and cost-effective provision of drugs through the application of specialized knowledge, skills and professional judgment.
- Demonstrate comprehensive knowledge of the practice of pharmacy and medication safety practices.
- Demonstrate the ability to plan, provide, and monitor the delivery of pharmaceutical services.
- Recognize the needs and concerns of others and maintain constructive relationships in interacting with them.
- Communicate effectively orally and in writing.
- Assume 24-hour responsibility for integration of interpersonal aspects in all patient care.
- Recognize personal responsibility in striving for innovative health care delivery which meets contemporary needs and assumes leadership in negotiating for changes in health care.
- Maintain knowledge of federal, state, and local laws and established standards concerning the practice of Pharmacy.
- Act in a consulting and advisory capacity to physicians, nursing, and various departments.



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- Work with automated systems. Grant Automated Dispensing System/Meditech access and privileges as appropriate.
- Accurately review and evaluate patient information
 - Uses at least two methods to identify patients before filling an order
 - Verifies that the requested order correlates with the patient's clinical history, presentation and physician's order
 - o Accesses the patient medical record appropriately
 - Documents in the medical record according to the facility standard/policy
- Appropriately treats Patients
 - Serves as a patient advocate when planning and implementing pharmaceutical care by considering the patient's disease conditions, age, background, and need for understanding and participation in drug therapy in a fiscally responsible manner
 - Utilizes outcome measures to assess the results of interventions administered to patients
 - Notifies the appropriate health provider when immediate treatment is necessary, based on procedural findings and patient condition
 - o Provides a written or oral summary of preliminary findings to the physician
 - Obtains patient's height, weight, and allergy information prior to dispensing first dose
 - o Clarifies medication orders with ordering physician, when necessary
- Comply with Infection Prevention
 - o Practices consistent hand hygiene
 - Uses personal protective equipment (PPE)
 - Has required immunizations per Division requirements
 - Adheres to Isolation Protocol precautions
