Certified Surgical First Assistant:

The Certified Surgical First Assistant must have equivalent qualifications, competence and function in the same role as employed individuals performing the same or similar services at the facility, as defined by facility job description.

Definition of Care or Service:

The Certified Surgical First Assistant is a specifically trained individual who provides assisting services for the surgeon in both the preparation for and performance of surgery.

Scope of Service may include:

- Assists the surgeon by providing retraction and aiding exposure of the operative site, to include proper positioning of the patient
- Anticipates the moves of the surgeon and assists in the safe and efficient completion of the surgical procedure
- Facilitates hemostasis of the surgical site by performing suction, irrigation and sponging the operative site during a surgical procedure
- Assists with skin or external suturing and stapling
- Assists with securing drainage systems and dressings
- Demonstrates Clinical and Service excellence behaviors to include code of HCA Healthcare conduct core fundamentals in daily interactions with patients, families, co-workers and physicians.

Setting(s):

• Surgical services areas including but not limited to hospitals and outpatient surgery centers

Supervision:

- Direct supervision by surgeon
 - o Indirect supervision by surgery department director, site manager or designee

• Two years of experience as a Certified Surgical First Assistant is preferred.

Competencies:

The Certified Surgical First Assistant will demonstrate:

- Safe environment for patients
 - Participates in the pre-procedure process to verify the correct procedure, for the correct patient, at the correct site / side and involves the patient in the verification process when possible.
 - o Participates in a time-out immediately before the start of an invasive procedure
 - Labels containers used for blood and specimens in the presence of the patient
 - Labels all medications and solutions on and off the sterile field in perioperative and procedural settings
- Surgical First Assistant Skills
 - Assist with positioning, prepping, draping of patient
 - Provide visualization of the operative field by the use of retraction, scissors, or electrocautery, as directed by the surgeon
- Assists the surgeon at the completion of the procedure by:
 - Affixing and stabilizing drains
 - Cleansing the wound and applying the dressing
 - Assist with application of cast, splints, and other devices
 - Inserts and removes urinary catheter
 - Harvests and prepares graft tissues (in cardiac surgery only)
- Infection Prevention
 - o Practices consistent hand hygiene
 - Uses personal protective equipment (PPE)
 - Required immunizations per Division requirements
 - Complies with Isolation precautions
 - Maintains sterile field
