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#### Section 1 – Introduction

#### 1) Purpose

The Academy of Information Technology (AIT) is committed to academic integrity. It is dedicated to proactively educating and supporting students to prevent breaches of academic integrity. This policy aims to ensure that academic integrity is a fundamental part of the overarching institutional and student approach to academic study.

AIT aims to have learning and assessment strategies that reduce the inclination to cheat, along with response mechanisms that demonstrate to the AIT academic community there is zero-tolerance for deliberate and premeditated academic fraud.

#### 2) Scope

This policy applies to all staff and students of the Academy of Information Technology (AIT) (including Left Bank and Coder Academy Australia) and the International School of Colour and Design (iscd).

It includes the institutions' approach to:

- Plagiarism
- Cheating in exams (Higher Education only)
- Contract cheating
- Collusion
- Misuse of AIT intellectual property
- Rigour in Investigation

It takes into consideration the various mediums used by students along with related copyright, intellectual property and moral rights.



#### Section 2 – Broad Strategies

AIT uses the following broad strategies to reduce academic misconduct

- i) Education:
  - (1) Educate students and staff in ethical and practical considerations
  - (2) Raises awareness of the Turnitin tool and the consequences of plagiarism
  - (3) Educate students of the academic misconduct processes, institutional and legal consequences
- ii) Support (Addressing issues that lead to loss of integrity):
  - (1) Provide literacy assistance
  - (2) Provide guidance and advice on time management and study skills
  - (3) Assist students in acquiring effective approaches to their assessments
  - (4) Identified and addresses learning gaps
- iii) Encourage (academic integrity through its teaching and learning environment):
  - (1) Academic staff lead through examples of good practice
  - (2) Assessment design encourages engagement and independent thinking
  - (3) Varying assessments from year to year
  - (4) Require students to document the development process of an artwork
  - (5) Require students to use visual diaries as a way to verify original ideas used an artwork
  - (6) Require students to reference artworks used to inspire their creative projects
  - (7) Schedule assessment submission dates to balance student workloads

## Penalties for Collusion

#### Penalties for Contract Cheating

Contract cheating is considered a serious form of academic misconduct. A student found to have used a third party (paid or unpaid) to undertake work for them may not only receive a fail for their assessment but may be suspended from their course and have their enrolment cancelled by AIT.

If a student is not satisfied with the outcome of this process, AIT has a robust appeals process which all students can access. (Information here)

#### Penalties for misuse of AIT Intellectual Property

- i) Suspension occurs when the student:
  - (1) Takes the material down immediately
  - (2) Has uploaded content only
  - (3) Is in their first term
  - (4) Is unaware of the seriousness of what they have done. (perhaps because of the culture they come from)
  - (5) Gets only non-financial award like more access
  - (6) Student uploads assessment questions
- ii) Expulsion occurs when the student
  - (1) Offends for the second time
  - (2) Uploads assessment answers
  - (3) Does not comply with a takedown request
  - (4) Gets money in exchange for AIT IP
  - (5) Intentionally uploads to a site that is widely known for cheating

If a student is not satisfied with the outcome of this process, AIT has a robust appeals process which all students can access. (Information here)
