

Project also in North San Jose Area Development Policy


Approved in 2005


- Extend Charcot Ave from O'Toole Ave to Oakland Rd




Purpose of Scoping Meeting



- Early Consultation with the Public [PRC Section 21083.9 & CEQA Guidelines Section 15083]
- Additional consultation combined with the Notice of Preparation [NOP]
 Process—Scope and Content of the Environmental Impact Report [EIR]
- Identify the range of actions, alternatives, mitigation measures, and significant effects to be analyzed in the EIR
- Eliminate issues found not to be important
- Resolve concerns of affected federal, state, and local agencies
- Solicit input from interested persons who might not be in accord with the action on environmental grounds.


