Build A Cancer Care Team

- Primary oncologist and nursing staff: Doctors that specialize in and treat cancer.
- Family and friends: Help with everyday tasks such as cooking, babysitting, or just to talk.
- Genetic Specialists: Help you determine your personal and familial risk of cancer, and the need for additional gene testing.
- Nutritionists: Help maintain your
 - nutrition during your cancer journey.

Get the Right Tests

The common tests that you should receive when cervical cancer is suspected is a biopsy of tissue from the cervix. Once the diagnosis is confirmed, imaging tests are performed such as:

- X-rays
- CT scan
- MRI

These determine the stage and extent of the cancer, which will aid in the decision of treatment options. Next Generation Sequencing (NGS) can help you determine your biomarker status, to assist in the selection of treatment.

Standard of Care

The most commonly recommended treatments for cervical cancer are:

- Surgery
- Radiation therapy
- Chemotherapy
- Targeted therapy
- Immunotherapy

Biomarker Status

Knowing your biomarker status can help determine the effectiveness of different therapies.

Clinical Trials

Cancer clinical trials are research studies used to improve treatments and quality of life for patients. There are 417 active clinical trials recruiting cervical cancer patients in the United States.
