THE ASHANTI MEDICAL TEAM

When a loved one is cared for by Ashanti Hospice, one of the many services they will receive is extra medical care in addition to what they already have.

Clients are seen by a RN for one-on-one visits weekly or every other week. And, in times of need, RN visits are increased to meet the need of the client. A physician is available to our RN team, 24/7, to answer questions and assist with coordination of care for our clients.

Dr. Joseph Peyton is the Medical Director of Ashanti Hospice and attends the Interdisciplinary Team Meetings on a biweekly basis. Dr. Peyton personally visits each of the Ashanti clients and is available for telephone or in-person meetings with our clients and their families, as requested.

A Care Partner/STNA will be providing one-on-one ADL (activities of daily living) care to the client 1-4 times per week. Care plan needs for each client is different, and is based on need.

Ashanti clients have the same RN and Care Partner, so that you and your loved one can develop a relationship with them and feel comfortable.
