Hannah Allen (Voice) A 2015 graduate of CCA, Hannah has been studying voice classically since the age of 17, though her passion for music and vocal performance began long before then. Along with her piano studies, she had extensive experience singing in choirs including the TPSMEA All State Choir, as well as in musical theater productions. After deciding to pursue voice, she was accepted to Gordon College and was awarded the Friends of Music Scholarship and The Grant Music Scholarship for Christian character. In addition to her passion for art song and choral music, she has extensive chamber experience, and continues to perform in musicals. Recent performances include Helena Landless in *The Mystery of Edwin Drood* and Amalia in *She Loves Me*.



Sarah Allen (Piano) holds a BM in composition from Samford University where she studied composition with Dr. Mark Lackey and piano with Dr. Kathryn Fouse.
