

FALL ANT PREVENTION



tips for keeping ants outside where they belong



keep surfaces clean.

Regularly clean floors and wipe down countertops and tables, particularly after mealtime.



keep pet dishes off the floor.

When possible, keep pet food and water off the floor. Additionally, store pet food in sealed containers. seal your food.

Store food in your pantry in airtight containers or sealed bags. Don't forget to clean inside cabinets and pantries to eliminate food debris.







Dispose of garbage regularly. Ants aren't picky eaters. If there's food, they will find it.



Inspect for water sources including plumbing leaks, dishes full of standing water in the sink, water around bathtubs, even inside houseplants.



Caulk small cracks and crevices around doors, windows, and utility lines to prevent ants getting inside in the first place.



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HOW TO SAFELY REMOVE TICKS



Here's what you'll need



Tweezers



Soap






STEP TWO

Using fine-point tweezers, grasp the tick as close to the head as possible -- do not

STEP ONE

Gently pull back any hair from around tick bite/head





STEP THREE

Pull the tick straight outward until the head is removed. Do not twist, turn or wiggle.







Wash area thoroughly with soap and water. You may also use rubbing alcohol.



Dispose of tick in toilet or closed trash can wrapped in tissue.

COLD WEATHER CREEPS

What are overwintering insects and how can you keep them from cozying up in your crib?

WHAT IS OVERWINTERING?

"Overwintering" is the process by which some insects wait out the colder months, taking shelter under tree bark, beneath plant materials, and inside buildings – like your house – until the weather turns favorable.

When it comes to your home, you will likely notice these insects most around the first signs of cold weather, when they are trying to get inside, and the first signs of spring, when they would rather be *out*.

WHAT INSECTS OVERWINTER?

Stink Bugs: The western conifer seed beetle and brown marmorated stink bug are the most common stink bugs in the US.



Boxelder Bugs: Boxelder bugs have elongated bodies, black with red-orange markings. They can bite when handled and can discolor fabric or furniture.



Asian Lady Beetles: Can vary in color, usually with a whitish area and M-shaped marking behind the head. They are primarily a cold-weather nuisance but can also emit an odor when they die.



HOW CAN I PROTECT MY HOME?

Your primary defense against winter stowaways is to simply deny access. If they can't get in, they can't stay.

- Seal cracks and crevices
- Fill holes around pipes and utility lines
- Repair torn screens
- Install door sweeps
- Ensure windows and doors close tightly
