

Active Learning with the Leganto Course Resource List Solution

Social Reading

In addition to communicating their ideas to their classmates, students can add private notes that only they can see.




Figure 1. Leganto Social Reading Screen




Figure 2: The Leganto Read & Respond Assignment Feature

Read & Respond Assignments

How can an instructor tell whether students are doing the assigned reading and whether they understand the content? Via the learning management system (LMS), instructors can now use the Read & Respond Assignment feature to leverage materials in the class's Leganto resource list and prompt students to answer questions and add comments to shared PDF files. The files can be articles, book chapters, images, research data, or any other type of resource that is available in PDF.

These Read & Respond assignments are seamlessly integrated into a course alongside all the other assignments, and the easy-to-use Leganto grading interface synchronizes the students' grades with the LMS gradebook.

What's in It for Instructors?

With the Leganto Social Reading and Read & Respond Assignment features, instructors support students' learning by:

- Increasing engagement. Students are transformed from passive attendees to involved participants.
- Fostering interaction. Reading tasks become collaborative and more stimulating, subtly encouraging every student to "speak" out.
- Assessing student work. Read & Respond Assignment activities help instructors motivate students to complete assigned readings and gauge students' understanding of the text.
