City officials partnered with aquatic design experts Burbach Aquatics, Inc., who recommended a fabric building as the most cost-effective solution for a clearspan enclosure of this size. Many fabric building options are constructed using aluminum trusses – a metal that quickly degrades in the presence of chlorine. The rigid steel frames used by Legacy Building Solutions are hot dip galvanized to eliminate the need for maintenance in a humid, highly corrosive environment.

Another benefit of the rigid steel frame is the ability to customize the building to meet project specifications and code requirements. The facility is lined and insulated for year-round use, while a climate control system keeps the environment comfortable for swimmers. Code requirements for this building included 90 mph windspeed as well as 30 psf snow load.

A white liner keeps the inside of the building clean and enhances the brightness available from the LED lighting system and window walls. The liner also serves as an air-tight protective barrier, shielding the insulation and framing from the high air-moisture content. The exterior membrane features a blue wave pattern, while large commercial glazed windows are framed along the front and sides of the building to provide additional natural light.

Being open every day means Chadron Area Aquatic & Wellness Center has expanded offerings year-round, like swimming lessons and water aerobics in addition to open swimming and water therapy. Community members use the building for events ranging from children's birthday parties to a Special Olympics event that brought people to Chadron from surrounding towns.

The new pool has features which were not available at the outdoor facility, including a therapy pool, waterslide, splash pad and zero-depth entry area. The building also includes a walking track and a rentable community room. "The response from the community has been very good," said Janet Johnson, Chadron city zoning and building official. "The expanded programming is very popular."

Expanded programming at the pool is benefitting residents of Chadron as well as residents of nearby towns. "Not a lot of communities in the panhandle have a facility like this," added Anderson. "They are starting to come to us. Not a lot of rural communities have the opportunity we do. What we're seeing is very high use for the water aerobics and lap swim and the therapy pool. And once people have completed their therapy, they tend to keep coming."
