


## Phone Banking at Laney: A Collaborative Effort

On June 8 - 10, student workers, Faculty Members, Classified Professionals and Administrators came together to launch a phone banking system to contact students who dropped classes during 2020-2021. Our team was able to export a contacts list to email, text and call, during the three-day period. During the calls, students were able to ask questions, get one-on-one support, and were pointed toward resources, for a truly successful start, to both summer and fall semesters. 1,115 students were contacted!


Laney College's Business and Construction Management departments have collaborated since August 2017 to offer college courses at EBMUD's maintenance center.

## Laney College and Alameda County

Alameda County celebrated Cluster 15 cohorts who successfully completed Laney College's management and supervision certificate program in May 2021. The program graduates earn 18 units which are transferrable to a CSU or UC for credit. Program graduates also received sixmonths of supervisory work experience credit from Alameda County for successfully completing the 14-months certificate program. During the program, graduate develop or enhance their skills and increase their knowledge to effectively manage a diverse workforce. Program graduates also have several career paths and promotional opportunities for professional advancement. Since 2018, business and program graduates can earn and obtain a management and supervision associate degree.
