A. PBC Committee Membership		E.3 — Fiscal Oversight	Aurelie Sciaroni, Student Representative and Helen Ku, Institutional Research Designee are new members. The new members introduced themselves and were thanked for their service.  (Vacant), Budget Director (Vacant), Classified Senate President		
B. Adopted Budget Update		E.3 — Fiscal Oversight	The Adopted Budget for Fiscal Year 2020-21 was approved by the Board of Trustees on October 27, 2020.		
C. BAM Model and SCFF		E.3 — Fiscal Oversight	Chancellor Walter introduced C.M. Brahmbhatt. His firm is working with PCCD in a variety of tasks. He has 25 years of extensive service in education and has already assisted the District with FCMAT and the SCFF. We are grateful to have him and his firm with us.  VC Ahmed shared the Current Budget Allocation Model with the PBC Committee. He addressed the following:		

(PBC Committee)		
District Office Services Centers Budgets were discussed including the Centralized Services Budget. Three (3) Year FTE Rolling Average received by Academic Affairs and Student Success. FY 202-21 Budget Allocation Model (BAM).		
Revenue Allocations regarding all the colleges and district were provided.		
Unrestricted Expenditure Budget by Colleges were demonstrated that the expenses are higher than the revenues for BCC and COA. But Laney and Merritt Colleges revenues are higher. The District does not bring in any revenues and that is the reason the expenses are noted in the red.		
C.M. Brambhatt with Cambridge West Partnership, thanked Vice Chancellor Ahmed for walking us through the existing budget for the Peralta District. He said it is important that members have a good starting point to determine how we can move forward from a Budget Allocation Model (BAM) to a Student Centered Funding Formula (SCFF).		
He said it was important to be mindful and he/his firm are available to PCCD to help us determine how we see our District and Colleges and on how we may do better to generate more funding with the ultimate goal of how to serve the students better.		
A Student Center Funding Formula (SCFF) presentation was made by C.M. Brahmbhatt. The document was also shared with the committee members.		

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	It was noted that there is no COLA in 2020-21.
	The funding was provided on a variety of numbers. Now it will be provided based on the last three (3) years information. Some districts are not able to do better and are striving to get more dollars.
	The Objective:
	Develop a new budget allocation model that respects the current allocation percentage and has a mechanism in place to transition over time that rewards the colleges by maximizing the incentives built into the SCFF.
	As a committee the District needs to:
	Improve awareness and understanding of the SCFF districtwide. Better understand our outcome data related to our student population. Develop a district internal revenue allocation model. Collect college level data. Evaluate, validate and analyze the data. Explore strategies to capture outcomes. Compare our data to surrounding college districts and, if needed, develop possible models for discussion and evaluation.
	Adopt a model based on solid evidence, using great data that works for our District. Then the Peralta District will be able to see if we are inline or not to have the funds to run the colleges and District. The District must be in full compliance.

		FY 2020-21 Budget model is in place. It may be possible to compare and take the BAM model versus the SCFF and see them side-by-side. It also may be possible to have FY 2021-22 and as a Distict we may not be able to implement SCFF right away.

The PBC is in close alignment with it. It appears the Budget Director (Vacant) position should not be on the list of membership.  Important to note that one of the Academic Senate President's would be the Faculty Co-Chair of the PBC.  Motion in order to update the committee membership to stipulate that one of the Academic Senate Presidents would be listed as the Faculty Co-Chair and that Budget Director be listed in the membership for the PBC.	

	Amended Motion to remove one of the college presidents before adding another administrator. Motion withdrawn.  Motion and seconded to extend the meeting until 11:15 am. Motion approved unanimously.  Motion and seconded that one of the Academic Senate President is explicitly designates as the Co-Chair of the PBC. Amended Motion that we repeat what is already in the AP and not change that. Motion not passed.  Noted that it is possible that in the PBIM Manual one Faculty and one Administrator is reflected as Co-Chairs. It also appears there may be three Co-Chairs. Clarification requested so that the motion taken is not in conflict. Requested that we table the Co-Chairs for the next meeting.
