- The world is getting smaller and more international, and the importance of understanding foreign languages and cultures grows constantly. If we can demonstrate the significance of these things to children from a young age, their learning results are much better than if they only start learning in school.



We based the decision purely on research, says Helisten. – Several brain studies have showed that at the age of 4–6 children go through a sensitive period for foreign language learning, so why not utilize it in early education?"
