<sup>1</sup> Immunization guide is per CDC recommendation.

<sup>2</sup> Hib--This dose only necessary for children age 12 through 59 months who received 3 doses before the 1st birthday.

<sup>3</sup> Flu--Two doses given at least four weeks apart are recommended for children age 6 months through 8 years of age who are getting an influenza (flu) vaccine for the first time and for some other children in this age group.

<sup>4</sup> HepA-- Two doses of HepA vaccine are needed for lasting protection. The first dose of HepA vaccine should be given between 12 months and 23 months of age. The second dose should be given 6 months after the first dose. All children and adolescents over 24 months of age who have not been vaccinated should also receive 2 doses of HepA vaccine.
