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Course Description

COVID-19 has kept more than a billion students out of the physical classroom, and has required us as practitioners to change practices overnight. As much as it feels like we have to change everything and that we are working outside the box - we are very much still operating “inside the box” where we have to meet district expectations while at home. Although it feels like everything is changing, the “core” of innovative teaching and learning continues to provide a foundation for our own success, and the success of our learners. This course, *Innovate In the [Virtual] Box with UDL*, will focus on the four components of the core of innovation as outlined in our book, [*Innovate Inside the Box: Empowering Learners Through UDL and the Innovator's Mindset*](#) and then help to scale the core and the Innovator’s Mindset through the principles of Universal Design for Learning (UDL).
