

## The 2021 Remote Influencer Report

At Remote, we believe that remote work should be easy and accessible. While many companies continue to struggle with the transition to remote work, knowing where to get the best advice is essential to get it right. With so many incredible people blazing a trail for the future of work, how do you know whom to follow? To answer that question, Remote is proud to announce the launch of The 2021 Remote Influencer Report.

#### What makes The 2021 Remote Influencer Report unique?

Our list is a little different from other influencer lists you may have seen.

When we started looking at who was really making an impact in the remote workplace revolution, we discovered a few different types of influencers leading the charge.

We found people who have worked remotely for years and have helped create the blueprint for remote work as it exists today. We found others who have analyzed effective workplace models and have sought out the data on the potential impacts of remote work. We found companies helping make remote work possible through online tools, training, and remote recruitment. Finally, we found the adopters — HR and business leaders tackling these challenges and transitioning their workforces to a remote model. In doing so, these adopters have found themselves at the forefront of this revolution, carrying insights other companies need to know.

Rather than provide a long list of influential remote work advocates, we went a little deeper to help everyone — companies considering remote work, those wondering how to improve their current models, individuals looking to transition to a remote work lifestyle, and recruiters wanting to stay ahead of the curve — to find the right people with the most useful insights for their individual needs.

#### How we built the report

We started with the hard research: social media analytics, publications from thought leaders, and manual desk investigation. We cross-referenced articles citing remote work influencers to see who was really leading the conversation. To ensure we found the best people, we researched academics and workplace experts who have been ahead of the curve on remote work innovations for decades. We also invited our community of remote work advocates to nominate outstanding individuals through our website. Finally, we looked at HR leaders of influential companies who are leading their organizations into the remote work future and sharing what they have learned.

We used four criteria to determine whether a person qualified for our list:

- 1. Are they advocating for remote and flexible work practices?
- 2. Are they actively leading change or influencing others?
- 3. Do they demonstrate innovation or disruptive thinking?
- 4. Do they provide accessible advice and guidance?

We wound up with a list of more than 300 people, all doing incredible things in the world of remote work and, although challenging, we paired this list down to 75 people.



#### Three types of remote work influencers

After evaluating the data, we categorized our list into three types of influencers:

#### **Prince Innovators**

Remote Innovators are the ones who blazed the trail for remote work. These people were working and leading remotely before it was cool. They founded all-remote companies before anyone had heard of Slack, studied workplace models, and uncovered data to find the potential impact of remote work on businesses, workers, and the economy. These influencers laid the foundation for the global shift to remote work.

#### **02** Remote Enablers

Remote Enablers are the ones making remote work possible today. These are the founders who have created remote work tools, plus the coaches and trainers helping people make the shift. Without these influencers, remote work would be much harder. We all rely on the tools and approaches they are creating to help empower distributed teams.

#### **Provide Accelerators**

Remote Accelerators are changing the game for the future of work. They are HR leaders at major companies, leading business journalists, and business leaders going remote. When they act, they take people with them, and it's thanks to them that the permanent shift to remote work is happening at all. These influencers are listening to the Innovators and using tools created by the Enablers to accelerate this shift for the long term.

From each of these three categories, we identified the 25 influencers making the strongest impact and catalogued them in this report. Identifying these people has been tough, and we know there are others who are making waves. That's why we will continue to accept nominations for remote influencers on our website for inclusion in future iterations of this list and other Remote Influencers projects.

Congratulations to all who made the list in 2021. Here are the 75 people every business, remote worker, and leader should follow for remote work insights and leadership this year.




