Arts Commons is bringing live music back to Calgary's downtown core with a free, family-friendly, and socially distanced outdoor concert: *SHOWTIME: A Live Music Celebration*

Classic Albums Live headlines with Creedence Clearwater Revival: Chronicle, Vol. 1 and Bow Valley folk-pop artist Amelie Patterson opens at Olympic Plaza, presented by Arts Commons and BD&P.

August 9, 2021 CALGARY – Calgary – you're invited to an Arts Commons yard party! Arts Commons is reenergizing Calgary's downtown cultural district with *Showtime: A Live Music Celebration*, a one-night-only outdoor celebration of food, drink, live music, and fun for the whole city with – yes – free admission. Join Arts Commons on Thursday, August 26 at 7 p.m. (gates open at 6 p.m.), culminating in a rock-out performance by Classic Albums Live – the beloved concert series that has consistently packed the Jack Singer Concert Hall for the past three seasons – performing Creedence Clearwater Revival's pivotal album, Chronicle, Vol. 1, in the great outdoors.

Admission is FREE for all ages, but pre-registration is required at artscommons.ca.

Showtime: A Live Music Celebration, part of Arts Commons Presents' 2020-21 season of the BD&P World Stage series, will bring the city together like only live music can – with a little folk, a little country, and a lot of rock and roll – all safely distanced right here in Calgary's beautiful Olympic Plaza, with limited first come, first served seating as well as food and beverage available for sale onsite.

As always, safety remains our priority: attendance will be capped at 25% capacity, there will be socially distanced picnic tables and space for distanced seating throughout the grounds, high traffic surfaces will be regularly disinfected, and masks are encouraged while audience members are moving around the site.

Opening the evening's festivities will be beloved local folk-pop songwriter and performer, **Amelie Patterson**. A multiple YYC Music Award-winner, Amelie Patterson's soaring vocals, comforting melodies, and self-described "glitchy" guitar sweeps you up into her world of living, breathing lyrics and songwriting.

The main act is crowd favourite from Arts Commons Presents, **Classic Albums Live**, performing iconic albums from rock and roll history note for note, cut for cut with some of Canada's best musicians – no wigs, no impersonations, just music. Classic Albums Live will be bringing **CCR's Chronicle**, **Vol. 1** to the stage with hits like *Suzie Q, Bad Moon Rising*, and *Fortunate Son*.
