Discover the connections of Indigenous and Afro-Caribbean/African Diaspora through live performance with Arts Commons Presents Braving Beauty Cabaret

June 28, 2021 CALGARY - Making its virtual premiere on Sunday, July 11 at 7 p.m. Braving Beauty Cabaret is the latest in the TD Amplify Cabaret series produced by Arts Commons Presents. Exploring two seemingly distinct communities and their surprising and provocative parallels, Braving Beauty Cabaret uncovers shared the cultural roots of the Indigenous Nations of Treaty 7 with those of the African and Afro-Caribbean using in dance, music, poetry, and movement followed by a talkback with audience members.

Co-curated by acclaimed actor, director, podcaster, and drag performer from the Kainai Nation in Southern Alberta, Marshall Vielle, along with artist, curator, and community leader born and raised in Nigeria, Toyin Lamas, Braving Beauty Cabaret unites their distinct perspectives to find common artistic and cultural ground using storytelling and music to express commonalities. The past year has been a time of substantial reckoning, from the issues raised from the Black Lives Matter protests of 2020 to the most recent tragedies unearthed at former Indian Residential School sites across Canada. Braving Beauty Cabaret allows two communities to take up space, share their truths through the evocative medium of live performance, and assume full control of their narrative.



"Aside from coming from two extremely marginalized groups, there's a lot of beauty in the sharing of our traditional ways of knowing and what has been passed on to us despite us both living in – and all of us living in - this incredibly colonized world," says Vielle. "A big part of the inspiration in bringing this [cabaret] together is understanding that for a lot of marginalized voices, it's incredibly hard to show up, especially when folks aren't always welcoming you in the best way. Coming together for Braving Beauty has been really special because it's been about how we can be brave enough to show off our beauty."



Marshall Vielle is an actor, director, podcaster, and drag performer from the Kainai Nation in Southern Alberta. He is a recent graduate from the University of Lethbridge where he received his Bachelors of Fine Arts, specializing in Theatre Performance. He is especially interested in using theatre for community development, having been involved in various projects both locally and internationally aimed at using artistic practices to encourage social change. He works as an advocate for diversity in the performance sector, while also lending his creativity to several Queer and Youth initiatives. His play Where the Two-Spirit Lives is a one person show encompassing storytelling, movement, and lots of lip-syncing as a way of celebrating the resurgence of Indigiqueer knowledge sharing paradigms from traditional ways of knowing.

Marshall is the recipient of the 2018 Theatre Calgary Stephen Hair Emerging Actor Award. When he is not acting, Marshall can be seen teaching as an Artist-in-Residence at Trickster Theatre or Improvising with Dirty Laundry, Calgary's longest running completely improvised soap opera.
