## <sup>\$</sup>250

installs the sidewalk leading to the front of a new home, where kids will draw with chalk during the summer.

### **\$1k**

installs all the interior doors of a Habitat home-doors that will give kids a quiet place to study for the first time.

<sup>\$</sup>5k

allows volunteers to install all the siding on a new Habitat home, protecting the home from a lifetime of unpredictable Minnesota weather.

**\$10k** 

covers the efficient heating in a Habitat house, saving a family money on utility bills and keeping them warm all winter long.
